

# Dual Credit Agreement 2017-2018

- Parent and/or legal guardian are responsible for paying tuition in full for dual credit class or classes. Failure to pay tuition on time will cause you to be dropped from the class or classes. If you are dropped from a class, there is no guarantee you can get back into the class.
- If a student completes the class or classes with a grade of 70 or above, O'Donnell ISD will reimburse up to \$100 per class to the parent and/or legal guardian who paid the tuition. Reimbursement will take place in January for fall term, June for spring term, September for summer term, and after official grade reports are received from South Plains College. A copy of the invoice must be turned in **prior** to the semester beginning.
- If a student drops, withdrawals, or fails a class, O'Donnell ISD will NOT reimburse monies for the current or preceding semester(s).
- Textbooks are to be purchased by the student; there will not be a reimbursement for textbooks.
- Students need to be aware they are responsible for all work and deadlines in accordance to the syllabus and must adhere to all South Plains College rules and regulations.
- If a student wants to drop a class, they must first be granted permission. They will then be placed in an OHS class that is equal to the course in which they were enrolled, and current dual credit grades will follow.
- To receive high school credit, you must pass the class or classes with a grade of 70 or above.
- If a class is taken during the spring semester of their senior year, final grades in the dual credit class will not be calculated for final ranking and GPA.
- Class or classes that are a state requirement must be taken prior to the spring semester of your senior year.
- Summer dual credit classes must be taken through South Plains College.
