ARE YOU INTERESTED IN TAKING DUAL CREDIT COURSES THIS SUMMER?

What are Dual Credit courses? These are college-level classes you take from South Plains College that count as both high school credits and college hours. ALL SUMMER COURSES ARE ONLINE; you must have access to a computer and internet service.

How much do they cost? It depends. Most classes cost you \$210 upfront. Then, as long as you make at least a 70 and complete the course, OISD will reimburse you \$100. If you take a CDEC course, there is no tuition fee for you. SPC does offer a payment plan.

What about textbooks? You are responsible for purchasing your own books. You can often borrow them or buy them from friends as well.

I know Dual Credit courses are weighted. What does that mean? Any weighted courses get an additional 10 points added when we calculate high school GPA. You must still make a 70 to receive credit (not counting the 10 points).

I'm in! How do I sign up? See me ASAP. You need to get signed up to take the TSI; you can't take any classes without passing at least one portion of the TSI. If you've never taken a class, we also need to set up a meeting with you and a parent to get some papers signed.

I've already taken a class. What do I need to do? You have it easier. Just see me to sign the enrollment form; then, you need to make sure you pay for tuition and order your books.

All 2018-2019 high school students are eligible for dual credit this summer. If you have any questions at all, come see me! Mrs. White
