 - J. School Nurse has been working on updating care plans for our students with Chronic Conditions such as Asthma and Seizures.

 - L. Our Principal and Counselor have been meeting with students as needed when we students that feel they need to talk with someone.
 - M. The School Nurse has been checking immunization compliance and ensuring all new students are up to date.
 - N. PCT Skills Night is tomorrow night, Thursday, March 26th at the PCT building.
 - O. C.A.F.E. Group will be helping with end of the year activities and field trips.
 - P. Health Clinic Data: School Nurse sees anywhere from 15-25 students a day. The top reasonings being stomach aches.
 - Q. Injury trends: Our most frequent injury comes from student's bumping their heads on the monkey bars on the playground during recess. No severe injuries have occurred from this.
 - R. School Nurse sent out reminder forms to parents the criteria we follow for sending students home sick or when they need to keep their student home.
 - S. During the Fall & Winter, we had multiple illnesses circulating, including stomach bugs, Flu, and Strep. We did have many student absences from these illnesses the past few months.
 - T. School Nurse is still looking into grants for AED's.
 - U. School Nurse will begin sending letters home to those students that will need updated shot records for the next school year and for those with Immunization declination forms that will be expiring prior to next school year.
